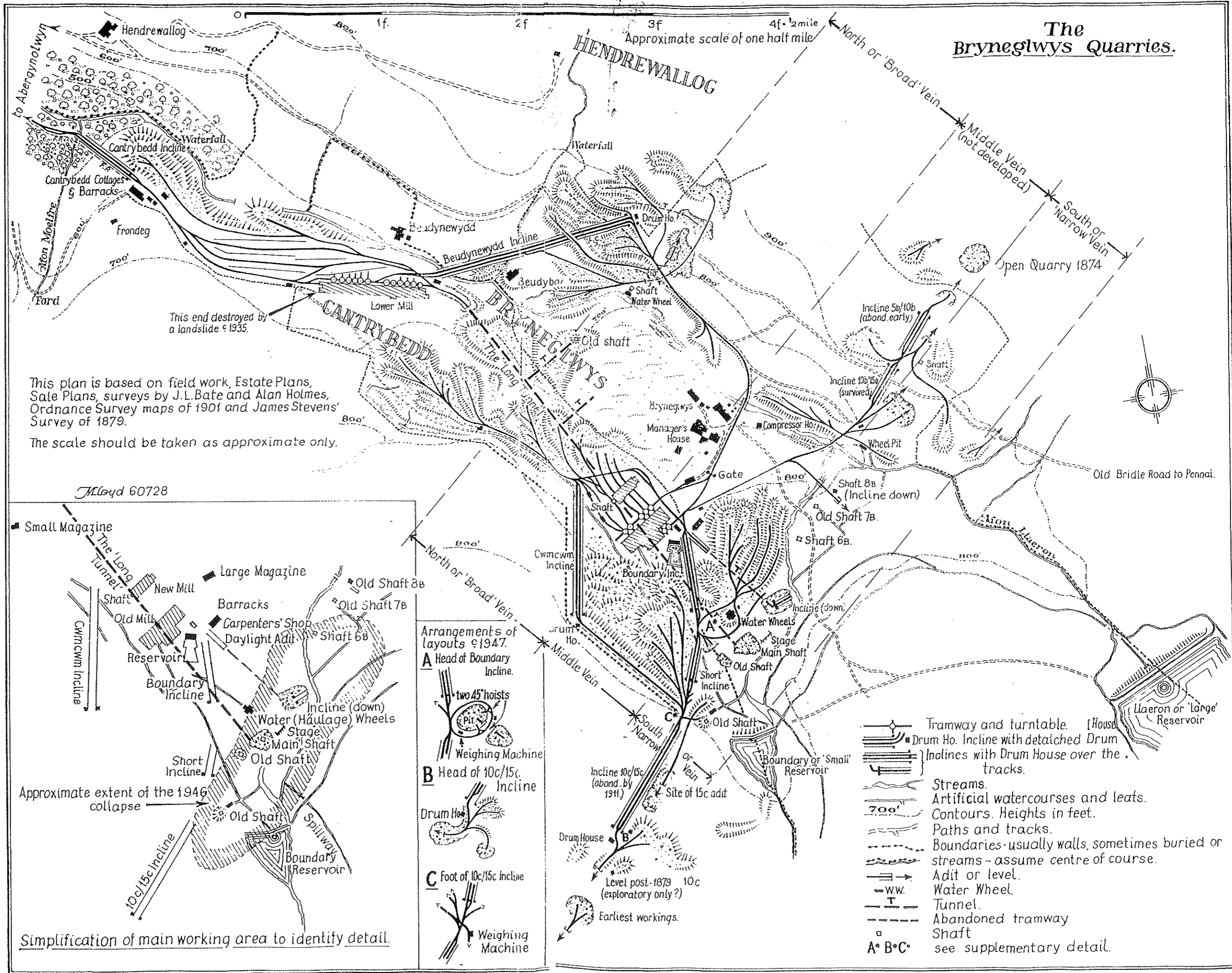


The Bryneglwys Quarries.
